

## **Request for Proposal**

Proposals will be received by the Columbia River Estuary Study Taskforce (CREST) until 1 p.m. local time on Friday June 19, 2009, for the project entitled CHINOOK DIVERSION PROJECT presented by April Silva, Project Manager, at:

Any proposals received after the appointed time for receipt cannot be considered.

The work to be performed under this contract consists of the following tasks. Proponents may propose one or more specific tasks. Approximate project budget is **\$100,000 - \$105,000**.

1. Partial removal of concrete weir, see Sheet 4
2. Construct concrete weir and floodplain grade control per Sheets 5-11
3. Install fish screening and hatchery diversion headgate, see Sheet 8
4. Provide and install LWD, see sheets 10-11
  - a. LWD must be provided from off site, species to be Douglas Fir and/or Sitka Spruce
5. Dewatering, TESC, restoration of site post project, see Sheet 12

The contractor shall begin work immediately upon receipt of notice to proceed. The Contractor shall complete all work no later than September 15, 2009.

Site access is being negotiated. Any changes to design documents will be resolved prior to contracting.

Proposers shall note that prevailing wages apply to this contract. Payment shall be within 60 days of invoice.

Interested parties for bid submission purposes may obtain the project manual consisting of proposer's instructions and plans from CREST.

No pre-proposal meeting is scheduled for this project, nor is any pre-qualification required. For site inspections, one site visit with project manager and landowner will be posted on the CREST website by June 5th. The contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible proponent based on the amount of proposal and the proponent's qualifications (see Request for Proposals), and subject to grant funding limitations. CREST may reject any proposal that does not comply with all prescribed public procurement procedures and requirements; and CREST may reject for good cause any or all proposals upon CREST's finding it is in the project's interest to do so. CREST reserves the right to waive the regularities or informalities in any proposals received or in the proposal process. No proposer may withdraw its proposal after the hour set for opening thereof or before award of contract, unless proposal award is delayed for a period of 30 days.
